

Tenterden and District Residents' Association Proposed Community Project Award

Aim

To engage with young people, who reside or attend school in the Tenterden area, and seek their ideas for projects that might best benefit the Town or the wider community. This is in support of the Association's constitution:

'TO SECURE THE PRESERVATION, PROTECTION, DEVELOPMENT AND IMPROVEMENT OF FEATURES OF HISTORIC OR PUBLIC INTEREST IN THE AREA'

Entry Criteria

Entrants must be resident in or in education in Tenterden or the surrounding villages, and be 18 or under on the Closing Date of 12th November 2015.

Entries may be submitted by individuals or groups, but no individual may participate in multiple entries.

Family members or relatives of the TDRA Committee are excluded from participating in this award.

Submission Instructions

The intent of these specifications is not to restrict entrants to a rigid format, but to provide the Committee with comparable, comprehensive and easily handled materials for review that will aid in organisation and distribution of the work.

The Committee's decisions will be based solely on the materials submitted.

All submissions must conform to the following conditions:

A - A4 format PDF, less than 8MB. The jury will first review a single printed Project Sheet from each entry, double-sided.

The front-side will provide evidence of the feasibility, and benefits for Tenterden through a photo(s), sketch(s), word(s) or other inspirational illustration(s) to capture the jury's attention and imagination. The back-side outline description will fill out the details of the project, providing context and background information to demonstrate why and for who the proposal will benefit.

B – 3-4 Supplemental A4 sheets may be included to further illustrate the concept. This may include photo(s), sketch(s), word(s) or other inspirational illustration(s). The Committee will review these to more deeply understand the entrants' proposals.

All entries should be emailed to chairman@tdra.org.uk. Please include in the email message "TDRA Community Project Award" followed by contact name.

Entrants must state clearly their name and preferred contact details on each sheet.

Judging Criteria

Judging of entries will initially be by the Committee and a shortlist will be prepared. Final adjudication will be by the President of the Association or other person deemed appropriate by the Committee.

The Committee reserves the right not to make an award should the number of entries, or the standard of entries received, not be deemed suitable.

Prizes

The winning entry will receive a prize of £500.00 and the Committee will use its best endeavours to work collaboratively with the local community to turn the idea into reality.

There will be two further commendation prizes of £125.00 each.

Award Programme

Call for entries will start from 1st June 2015

Valid entries must be received by midnight on 12th November 2015.

No late or incomplete entries will be accepted.

Award Notification and Image Use

The Community Project Award winners will be announced on the TDRA website and in the Kentish Express Tenterden by 3rd December 2015

By virtue of entering the awards, entrants agree to grant the organisers a licence to reproduce any material for the purpose of publicising the awards, provided that the author's name is credited and that the organisers take reasonable steps to ensure that such credit is given.
