3. Minutes of the last meeting

4. Matters Arising

GDPR – H Burnside reported that there were approximately 240 signed returns, which is about 40% of the membership. It was then agreed that it was necessary for us to comply on the basis that we process data on the basis of legitimate interest. It was deemed that no formal contract was necessary, and this was implied by membership, and the statement of policy in the Chairman's Report in The Resident agreed with the sentiment. We then discussed whether it was necessary to appoint a Data Officer, and it was agreed that we did not. H Burnside to try again at getting the remaining members to complete the form, although it was agreed that we do not lawfully need to have them. It was felt however, that for those who have not renewed each year we must delete the data. **HB2**

The Committee then discussed whether or not it was necessary to have membership cards. It was agreed that it was not as identification could be verified at the time of a contentions vote, and to date there had never been such an issue. This would also avoid unnecessary extra cost.

7. **Focus Groups**

Cinema and Culture Hub. Meeting to be held on 5th July with presentations from the consultants and architects to report their assessment of various sites. There was some concern that the new Mayor appears to be less than supportive. However this will be an open meeting.

Recreation Ground – meeting to be held at the beginning of July.

Proposal for Sports Ground on the Smallhythe Road. TTC Sports Sub Committee is looking at doing a deal with the owner of Morghew, with a view to leasing 30 acres for sports fields on the south side of Smallhythe Road, adjacent to the cricket pitch and pavilion. A quid pro quo being to allow five or six houses to be built there. This is of concern because this is in an area of outstanding natural beauty and a conservation area. There was less concern however, about the provision of pitches in this area as distinct from buildings. It was agreed that there was nothing to be done until a proposal was made.

A Greaves asked if we should make a short presentation of our achievements at the Annual Town Meetings. It was agreed that a short report would be given in future.

A Greaves asked if we were aware of the Community Forum being run by Justin Nelson under the title Tenterden Homes. This was news to the Committee, which was viewed as possibly controversial as it concerns the Waites site.

A Greaves noted a report by Rachel Woods on the Pope House Farm proposal and asked if S Nepp was going to make a statement. The Chairman replied that we had already objected as it was in High Halden.
