Presentation for Sept. 29th

A prototype for the power-point presentation was viewed and approved by the group for its general structure and content. Recommendations included verbal mention of Tenterden as ‘Jewel of the Weald’, visual reference to the lost green space at Three Fields, clearer distinction between Open Space and Local Green Space designations, separation of the two fields comprising the Tenterden Recreation Ground (into Glebe and Rec.) and a boundary adjustment to the Turners Field plan. Richard to check the British Airways quote (it relates to the entire UK).

The printed ‘flyer’

The addition to the flyer of a ‘*Your Views and Support Welcome*’ label, with contact details, was discussed. Daisy to explore possibilities. Distribution of the flyer will be agreed at the meeting on August 30th. Notice boards at Paydens, St Michaels Village Hall and at Ivy Court were considered important.

Evaluation of 8 possible Local Green Space Sites

Sets of evaluation forms were supplied for all 8 sites and divided between the 6 members of the working party for completion by August 30th.

Richard to establish the current status of Kiln Field at Abbott Way as a possible 9th site. (Subsequent enquiries revealed it to be in the ownership of Ashford Borough Council, leased to Tenterden Town Council as a wildflower meadow and public space for a period of 25 years – to exclude it from the sites presented in September, but not necessarily from longer-term LGS documentation/designation).
